rAga- Bhairav (mAyAmAlavagaula)

rAga – bhUpAli (mohanam)

rAga- kedAr (hamlr kalyAni)

chalayasi vikramaNe (keshava) balim adbhuta vAmana
pada nakha nlra janita jana pAvana
keshava dhrta **vAmana rUpa**

rAga – paTdIp

kshatriya rudhira maye (keshava) jagadapagata pApam (keshava)
snapayasi payasi shamita bhava tApam
keshava dhrta **bhrgupati rUpa**

rAga – bihAg (behAg)

vitarsi dikshu raNe (keshava) dikpati kamanlyam
dashamukha mauli balim ramaNlyam

rAga - durgA

vahasi vapuShi vishade (keshava) vasanam jaladAbham
halahati bhlti milita yamunAbham
keshava dhrta **haladhara rUpa**

rAga – pUryA dhanasri (kAmavardhani)

nindasi yajna vidheh (keshava) ahaha shruti jAtam
sadaya hrdaya darshita pashu ghAtam
keshava dhrta **buddha sharIra**

rAga – vrndAvani (brndAvani)

mleccha nivaha nidhane (keshava) kalayasi karavAlam
dhUmaketum iva kimapi karAlam
keshava dhrta **kalki sharIra**
